Gathering Rite

Tena koutou katoa

Greetings to you all as we gather here today to hear God's word and unite with him in the Eucharist. We're gathered together today to celebrate the 26th Sunday of Ordinary Time in the Season of Creation.

In the first reading Ezekiel challenges the House of Israel to act justly and with integrity.

Matthew's gospel tells us of a father asking his two sons for help. One replies yes but doesn't help and the other says no to his father then changes his mind and does help. Both Ezekiel and Jesus assure us that even when our first word is "No", God has the last word, and it is "Yes."

Our focus today for the Season of Creation theme is on the rivers. We rely on rivers and streams to irrigate our farmlands and provide clean drinking water as well as the enjoyment and wonder these waterways give us. Our lives depend on healthy rivers and streams.
