THE COMMEMORIATION OF THE LORD'S ENTRANCE INTO JERUSALEM

On this day the Church recalls the entrance of Christ the Lord into Jerusalem to accomplish his Paschal Mystery. Accordingly, the memorial of this entrance of the Lord takes place at all Masses, by means of the Procession (First Form) or the Solemn Entrance before the principal Mass (Second Form) or the Simple Entrance before other Masses (Third Form). The Solemn Entrance, but not the Procession, may be repeated before other Masses that are usually celebrated with a later gathering of people.

First Form: The Procession

- The Procession takes place at a smaller church or another suitable place. The faithful hold branches in their hands. When the Priest and ministers approach, the antiphon, "Hosanna to the Son of David" or another appropriate chant is sung. The Priest invites the faithful to participate actively and consciously in the celebration.
- The Blessing of the Palms takes place.
- Following the Blessing, the Deacon or Priest proclaims the Gospel.
- Incense may be used, if appropriate.
- A brief homily may be given.
- The procession to the Church where Mass will be celebrated, then takes place.
- The proper chants or other appropriate songs are sung.

Second Form: The Solemn Entrance

When a procession outside the church cannot take place, the entrance of the Lord is celebrated inside the church by means of a Solemn Entrance before the principal Mass.

Holding branches in their hands, the faithful gather either outside, in front of the church door or inside the church itself. The Priest and ministers and a representative group of the faithful go to a suitable place in the church outside the sanctuary, where at least the greater part of the faithful can see the rite.

While the Priest approaches the appointed place, the antiphon "Hosanna to the Son of David" or another appropriate chant is sung. Then the blessing of branches and the proclamation of the Gospel of the Lord's entrance into Jerusalem take place, as above. After the Gospel, the Priest processes solemnly with the ministers and representative group of the faithful through the church to the sanctuary, while the responsory As the Lord entered or another appropriate chant is sung.

Arriving at the altar, the Priest venerates it. He then goes to the chair and, omitting the Introductory Rites of the Mass and, if appropriate, the *Kyrie* (Lord, have mercy), he says the Collect of the Mass, and then continues the Mass in the usual way.

At all other Masses of this Sunday at which the Solemn Entrance is not held, the memorial of the Lord's entrance into Jerusalem takes place by means of a Simple Entrance.

While the Priest proceeds to the altar, the Entrance Antiphon with its Psalm (no. 18) or another chant on the same theme is sung. Arriving at the altar, the Priest venerates it and goes to the chair. After the Sign of the Cross, he greets the people and continues the Mass in the usual way.

Blessing of the Oils

- The Blessing of the Oil of the Sick and of the Oil of Catechumens and the Consecration of the Chrism are carried out by the Bishop, according to the Rite described in The Roman Pontifical, usually on this day, at a proper Mass to be celebrated during the morning.
- If, however, it is very difficult for the clergy and the people to gather with the Bishop on this day, the Chrism Mass may be anticipated on another day, but near to Easter.
- In accord with traditional practice, the Blessing of the Oil
 of the Sick takes place before the end of the Eucharistic
 Prayer, but the Blessing of the Oil of the Catechumens
 and the Consecration of the Chrism takes place after
 Communion.
- Nevertheless, for pastoral reasons, it is permitted for the entire Rite of Blessing to take place after the Liturgy of the Word.
- The reception of the Holy Oils may take place in individual parishes either before the celebration of the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper or at another time that seems more appropriate.

THE SACRED TRIDUUM NGĀ RĀTAPU O TE PĀKATE

HROUGH HIS PASCHAL MYSTERY, the Lord Jesus redeemed the human race and gave perfect glory to the Father.

BY DYING, Christ has destroyed our death.

BY RISING restored our life. For this reason the Sacred Triduum, is the high point of the liturgical year.

(See Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year, 18-19)

Pastoral Notes for the Celebration of the Paschal Triduum in Newly United Parishes with more than One Church:

When the ceremonies of the Triduum are examined we see that The Mass of the Lord's Supper begins with the usual Entrance Chant and ends with a blessing. The Good Friday Celebration begins in silence, opens with the Collect and ends without a blessing, simply a Prayer over the People. The Paschal Vigil begins with a greeting but there is no entrance song. This examination helps us to understand that we approach the liturgies of the Triduum not as three individual experiences but rather as one single liturgy that lasts three days. As the three principal ceremonies belong together, their progress is enhanced by returning to one particular place for their celebrations.

This consideration is confirmed by the rubric at the end of the Mass of the Lord's Supper which tells us,

"If the celebration of the Passion of the Lord on the following Friday does not take place in the same Church, the Mass is concluded in the usual way and the Blessed Sacrament is placed in the tabernacle" (Mass of the Lord's Supper, n44)

We find, in The Circular Letter Concerning the Preparation and Celebration of the Easter Feasts (CDW, 22 February 1988) the following:

"It is fitting that small religous communities, both clerical and lay, and other lay groups should participate in the celebration of the Easter Triduum in neighbouring principal churches. (46)

Similarly where the number of participants and ministers is so small that the celebrations of the Easter Triduum cannot be carried out with the requisite solemnity, such groups of the faithful should assemble in a larger church.

Also, where there are small parishes with only one priest, it is recommended that such parishes should assemble, as far as possible, in a principal church and there participate in the celebrations." [Circular Letter (CL), n 43]

It also notes, nn 41 and 42, tht it is important to have a sufficient number of fully trained ministers and that the chants of the people, the ministers and the priest are of special importance, especially those of the Paschal Vigil, because they add to the solemnity and also because the texts are more effective when suna.

These considerations lead us to the conclusion that the ceremonies of the Paschal Triduum be celebrated in either the principal church of the parish or in that which has the most suitable circumstances and space for graceful and arace-filled celebration.

Pastoral Note:

- The entire celebration of the Easter Vigil must take place during the night, after darkness has fallen and end before daybreak on the Sunday.
- Only one Paschal Candle is prepared, lit and carried into the Church. Candles for other Churches in the parish or pastoral area are prepared privately, placed in their stand and lit before the Mass of the Day begins.

(Easter Vigil, n. 8, Circular Letter n. 82)

- The proclamation of the Exsultet is sung by a Deacon, or in his absence by the Priest himself, by another con-celebrating Priest or in case of necessity by a layperson.
- The Paschal Candle is left near the ambo or in the middle of the sanctuary until Pentecost and is lit for all liturgical celebrations.
- The reading of the Word of God is central to the Easter Vigil, though, for pastoral reasons, the number of readings may be reduced.
- At least three Old Testament readings must be retained, of which one must be Exodus 14. (Third reading)
- For very serious reasons only two Old Testament readings may be used of which one must be Exodus 14.
- Silence may replace the Responsorial Psalms.
- Bells may be rung during the Gloria, but this should not overshadow the solemn singing of the Alleluia before the Gospel.

Pastoral Notes

- The Sacred Paschal Triduum ends with Evening Prayer.
- Easter Time has begun.
- The celebration of the Octave of Easter is most important: these days rank more highly than Solemnities.

Sequences

In liturgy, the word "sequence" refers to a hymn that follows the gospel acclamation on particular feast days.

The Roman Rite uses hymns sparingly at Mass, preferring to draw on the psalms as its source fo the entrance antiphon and Communion antiphon. However, the Missal has retained four hymns during the Liturgy of the Word. They are called Sequences.

These Sequences developed in the eighth and ninth centuries and multiplied during the early tenth to twelfth centuries. In the Graduale Romanum we discover that a number of the festal "Alleluias" before the gospel ended with a complex series of notes sung by choir or cantor on the last "a". The sequences developed as a mnemonic aid to memory for the notes. These in turn became the verses of the sequence, so called because it "followed" the Alleluia. In the reform of the lituray following the Council of Trent only four sequences were retained, for Easter, Pentecost, Corpus Christi and the Funeral Mass. In the renewal of the Missal which followed the Second Vatican Council, only two, 'Victimae Paschali Laudes' (Christians to the Paschal Feast) on Easter Sunday and 'Veni Sancte Spiritus' (Holy Spirit, Lord of Light) on Pentecost Sunday remain mandatory (GIRM #64). Two further optional sequences were retained, 'Stabat Mater' and 'Dies Irae', sung respectively on the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows and at Funeral Masses.

During the great Feasts of Easter and Pentecost, these poetic Sequences are sung to enhance the joyful momentum that builds towards the proclamation of the Gospel. Consider using a solemn Gospel procession and invite the whole assembly to sing "O Flock of Christ" on Easter day and "Holy Spirit, Lord Divine" at Pentecost.

Congregational settings of both Sequences may be found in the Living Parish Hymnal and Catholic Book of Worship II.
