copying music, projecting lyrics, or creating worship aids?

You need a licence for that!

The celebration of **liturgy and prayer** is distinct from education.

In order to **engage with contemporary liturgical music publishers**, such as GIA, OCP and Willow, a copyright licence specific to liturgical music is required. (Hymns and songs for worship are not covered by the NZSTA licence for education).

Church music copyright agencies provide affordable, accessible and legal means to reproduce music for prayer and worship.

3 Key Measurements for Checking Copyright Compliance

- 1. Do you **own** an original published edition of the music you wish to copy?
- 2. Does your licensing agency **cover copyright** for this particular music title?
- 3. Are you regularly **reporting usage** of each title every time it is used to your licensed copyright provider for liturgical music through one or more liturgical copyright providers?

If any of the above is missing then your school is not yet correctly licensed for copyright of liturgical music.

In order to become copyright compliant for liturgical music, **help is at hand!** Each diocese has people who have been trained to assist schools.
